## Hurricane Isaias Recovery Update August 5, 2020

### Utilities Status:

- Most outages from JOEMC and Duke Energy have been restored.
- Services have been restored for all Town of Surf City water and sewer customers.

### Beach Status:

- Moderate rip current conditions.
- No major damage to the beach strand.
- No major damage to the public beach accesses, minor repairs are being complete, but they are open and safe for public use.
- Beach signage and flags were removed prior to the storm and crews are working to reinstall. Please be patient as this process takes a little time with everything going on.
- Hatteras ramps will be put back in place as soon as we are able.

### Roads Status:

- Crews have been removing bulk sand on the roadways to ensure they are passable and will come back to get the thin layers that pose no immediate traffic issues.
- The town is acquiring equipment to finish removing the thin layer of sand from the roads and sidewalks. That equipment is due to arrive Thursday, and crews will begin to clear areas. More details of the schedule to come.
- Road signs damaged or missing, please drive carefully.

### Trash Pick-up:

- Changes to trash pick-up are:
  - Trash carts missed for Monday's island pick-up will be collected Friday. Please place trash carts out Thursday evening.
  - Tuesday island pick-up will be collected Wednesday, please place trash carts out Tuesday.
  - Wednesday mainland pick-up is running on normal schedule.
  - Friday second trash pick-up is running on normal schedule.

## Debris Status:

The Town of Surf City is requesting all VEGETATIVE debris generated by Isaias be placed in the **right of way** within ten (10) feet of the edge of pavement (street) or back of curb. Vegetative debris that is outside of ten (10) feet will NOT be picked up.

Over the next couple of weeks, the Town will be going around and picking up vegetative debris. When specific dates and areas are identified, this information will be published.

- Vegetative debris should be no longer than four (4) feet in length and twelve (12) inches in diameter.
- Please **DO NOT** block sidewalks or driveways
- Please remember – vegetative debris generated by **ISAIAS ONLY** should be placed near the road
- Construction and Demolition debris **WILL NOT** be picked up. If you have C&D debris resulting from the storm, please dispose of that properly.
