Hurricane Isaias Recovery Update August 10, 2020

Utilities Status:

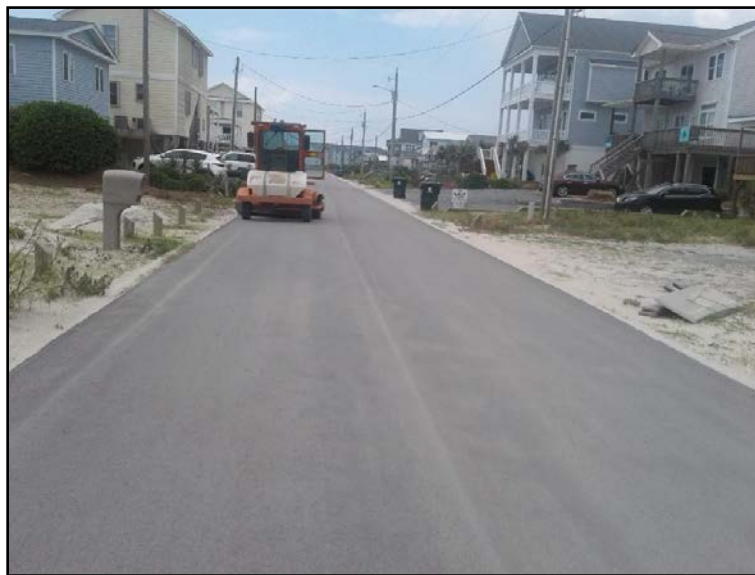
- JOEMC and Duke Energy are both reporting no outages.
- Services have been restored for all Town of Surf City water and sewer customers.

Beach Status:

- Beach access flags and rule signage have been reinstalled. Town staff took this opportunity to implement the Fire Department's long-term project to install beach condition flags and flotation devices at accesses 13-23.
- Hatteras ramps will be put back into place as soon as possible.

Roads Status:

- The street sweeper was delivered late Friday afternoon, and crews have been working to clear the identified areas.
 - **PLEASE REMOVE ALL VEHICLES FROM THE SIDE/NEAR THE SIDE OF ROADS.**
 - **A sweeper with a large rotary broom will be used to remove sand. It will kick up dust in dry conditions.**
 - **We urge you to avoid areas where they are working as much as possible, for your safety as well as the Town crews.**



- Road signs may be damaged or missing, please drive carefully. Report a missing or damaged sign by contacting 910-328-4131.
- NCDOT will begin their road sweeps Tuesday, August 11th. These crews will begin on the south end of the island and work north. Please be patient and expect delays as this will require a lane to be inaccessible.
- As a reminder, town-owned streets are handled by Surf City, NCDOT roads are handled by NCDOT. We will coordinate these efforts.

Trash Pick-up:

- Trash pick-up is on a normal schedule this week.

Vegetative Debris Status:

- Town crews will begin to pick-up VEGETATIVE debris generated by Hurricane Isaias, on **Wednesday, August 12th**. Please have all VEGETATIVE debris out by this time. Crews will only go to each location once, after that, it is the property owner's responsibility to haul debris.
- Vegetative Debris Separation & Removal Guidelines
 - Must be placed in the right-of-way within ten (10) feet of the edge of pavement (street) or back of curb. Vegetative debris that is outside of ten (10) feet will NOT be picked up.
 - Vegetative debris should be no longer than four (4) feet in length and twelve (12) inches in diameter.
 - Please DO NOT block sidewalks or driveways.
 - Please remember - vegetative debris generated by HURRICANE ISAIAS ONLY should be placed near the road.
 - Construction and Demolition debris will NOT be picked up. If you have C&D debris resulting from the storm, please dispose of it properly.
- Vegetative Debris Pickup Schedule
 - Island – South to North
 - Mainland – Roland, Atkinson Point, Little Kinston, Driftwood, and all other roads in Town limits.
 - Mainland - Subdivisions
- As a reminder, the next scheduled yard debris pick-up is on November 16-20 and the next scheduled bulk item pick-up is September 14-18. [Visit here for complete schedule.](#)
